	Lessons Learned/Learning
	People appreciate virtual options for access and ease but maintaining cohesion
	and engagement with hybrid groups is challenging. Courses in exclusively in
	person or exclusively virtually are the most successful.
	• They are working on perfecting the cadence of the classes. One-hour sessions
	weekly aren't enough, but gaps between two-hour classes every other week
	resulted in more individuals dropping out of the classes.
