Council Business

In Person Meetings: There are funds in the budget for two in-person meetings. Kelly asked which two months the group would prefer. There was a clear preference for July and October. Russha asked if the Council is willing to meet for a longer period of time for the in-person meetings.

State Plan: The plan has been submitted to CDHS leadership and approval is expected in about three weeks. Ian wanted to know if there is a chance that the leadership would request changes. Kelly said that is possible, but she doesn't expect significant changes.

Brain Injury Data: The Council previously requested updated data on brain injury. There isn't a study more recent than the one completed in 2016 by Craige Hospital. Those researchers have offered to attend the April meeting to do a presentation.

Leading Practices Academy: The National Association of State Head Injury Administrators is hosting a Leading Practices Academy focused on Criminal Justice. That begins later this month and MINDSOURCE will be participating in that. Kelly said the team is leaning toward a focus on intimate partner violence.

Community Grants: The Trust Fund Board is working on preparing for the community grants. They are tentatively scheduled for announcement in March with funding to begin July 1, 2024.

Brain Injury Awareness Month: Brain Injury Awareness Month is March.

Laura suggested including issues that come along with brain injuries, such as migraines, in the recovery information.

lan wants to be sure information regarding sports and brain injury is included. Maria wanted to do shoutouts to groups that aren't brain injury focused who are doing work in the field.

lan wants to include information on peer support groups and the Centers for Independent Living.

Council Recruitment: There are four seats on the Council that will be vacant when terms end in June. The Bylaws encourage current members to participate in recruitment. Full membership on the Council is 20 members. There representatives required from certain organizations by the ACL grant, and there are organizations that the Council have identified wanting representatives from. 50% of the Council members must have lived experience, and it is important to have a diverse group of people.

Joy wants to be intentional in the recruitment. She was personally asked to join and feels that is a positive way to reach potential members.

Mid-Year Report: Amy provided the mid-year report on the Council activities. SAIL: ACC canceled their SAIL class because it only had two registrants. They are working with outreach and partnerships with the Dept or Vocational Rehab, TANF/SNAP, and foundations to subsidize tuition. A new class starts in February. Maria is hosting classes through Pueblo Brain Injury and the Center for Self-Reliance. They are focusing on outreach to young adults, Spanish speakers, and folks outside of Pueblo. A new class launched this month. She has found that some of the language in the class is too clinical and wants to encourage more layman terms. BIAC led a virtual class co-led by peer mentors. They started a new class earlier this month and another scheduled to begin in the spring. Laura gave an update on the class she led. Participants report increases in self-esteem



and self-confidence, the have a general sense of "fitting in." They started attending the facilitators' groups and other BIAC classes and workshops, and had dramatic improvements in interpersonal interactions. Laura sent individual follow up emails to participants after each class about key pots discussed, resources mentioned and remind about the homework. She also emailed BIAC staff updates after every session. Marissa reported that SAIL is one of the most requested programs requested by BIAC clients and wants to find out if there is a way to get more participants. Ben suggested the peer mentors be trained as SAIL facilitators.
